Bounded rationality basics



Paradigmatic cognitive bounds (limited abilities, cognitive costs ...) affect how rational agents should cognize.

2. Process focus

Study the process of inquiry, not the attitudes it produces

3. Heuristic cognition

Rational agents often rely on a toolbox of fast-and-frugal heuristic strategies

4. Ecological rationality

Rational cognition involves choosing strategies that work well in a given environment.

5. Vindicatory epistemology

The right theory of bounded rationality should vindicate the rationality of many seemingly irrational cognitions
